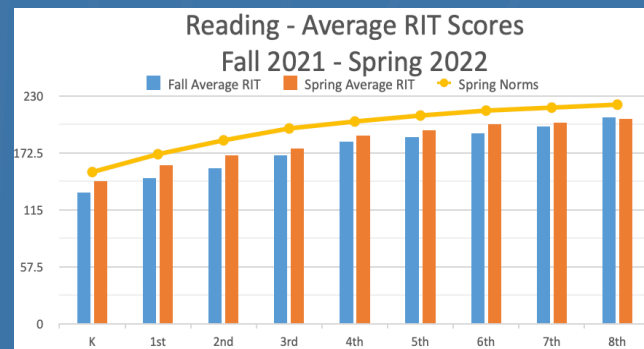

By 06/30/2025, the school will improve the performance of all students, All Grades students at/in Beacon Academy to increase 3.60 % in Attendance using State Report Card.

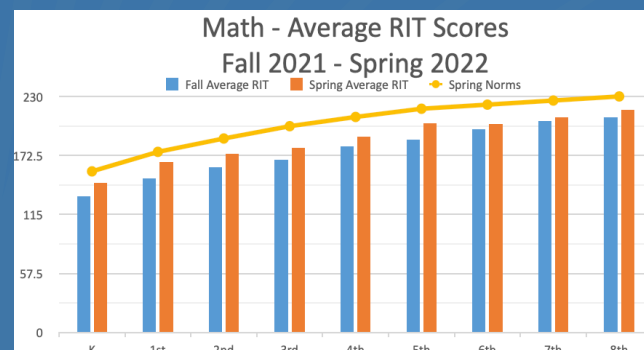
