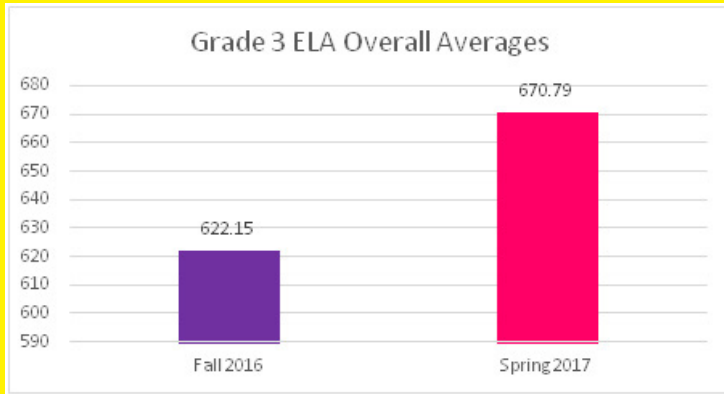

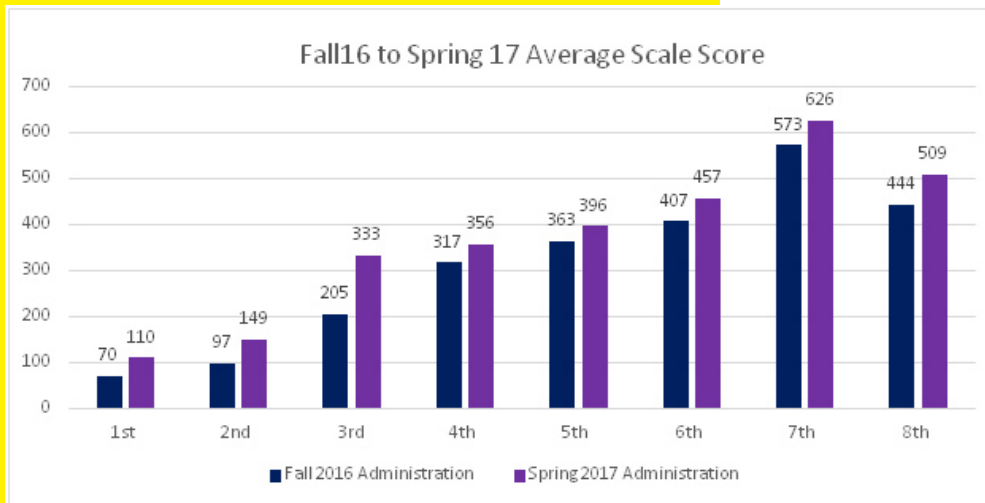

## OHIO STATE TESTS (AIR)



- Third Grade ELA – overall average scale score has continuously increased from one test administration to the next.

## RENAISSANCE STAR 360



- KRA – 66.7% met/exceeded state mandated cut score of 263 for the language/literacy portion of the KRA.
- Early Literacy – 31.2% overall increase in scores from the fall to winter test administration.
- Reading - Overall grades 1-8 increased 15.9% in reading from the fall to winter test administration, with 2nd grade increasing 54.6%.
- Reading – from the fall 16 to spring 2017 administration, grades 1-8 all showed growth (increased overall scaled score).
